Explore the hiking trails of San Carlos with your family. Take a family walk through any of the local hiking trails. Or take a guided hike to visit Pulgas Ridge, home to the Dusky Footed Wood Rat and several early blooming wild flowers, plus the ruins of Hassler Home. The noon hike is about two miles on a paved road and is suitable for jogging strollers. The elevation gain is 400 ft. The 2:30 PM hike is about three miles, on a single track trail, and is suitable for children 6yrs and older. Bikes are not allowed on either trail but the family dog, on leash, is welcome

We are having our second San Carlos City-Wide Roshambo (Rock, Paper, Scissors) Contest during Week of the Family, with finals during Family Game Night at the Adult Community Center. "At-large" finalists, school champions will participate in the finals. Prizes will be awarded. If you are interested in participating in the "at-large" division, please sign contact the chair prior to the event. Everyone can play and there are no age restrictions.

**Rules:**

- You and your opponent make a fist with one hand and tap it three times on the fist of the other hand (or another hard surface).
- You and your opponent should both count the strokes out loud.
- On the third tap you and your opponent should both make or "throw" your characterizations of either ROCK, PAPER, or SCISSORS very distinctly, at the exact same time, so there is absolutely no mistake what you threw.
- Winner is awarded 1 point. (Rock dulls/beats scissors. paper covers/beats rock, scissors cuts/beats paper.)
- If you and your opponent "throw" the same character, no points are awarded.
- The first person to gain 10 points wins; however, you must win by 2 points.

*Young people need to develop positive values. They need a strong sense of their own power, purpose, worth, and promise. Healthy competition encourages our youth to get excited about learning new things, having fun, and living out positive values such as honesty, caring, and sportsmanship.*
